General ice thickness guidelines When is ice safe?

There really is no sure answer. You can't judge the strength of ice just by its appearance, age, thickness, temperature, or whether or not the ice is covered with snow. Strength is based on all these factors -- plus the depth of water under the ice, size of the water body, water chemistry and currents, the distribution of the load on the ice, and local climatic conditions.

As a general rule for new, clear ice only:

* 2" or less - STAY OFF


* 4" - Ice fishing or other activities on foot

Sylvan? - From Wikipedia, the free encyclopedia

Sylvan or **Silvan** refers to an association with the <u>woods</u>. Specifically, that which inhabits the wood, is made of tree materials, or comprises the forest

itself. The term can also refer to a person or place that resides in the woods or a spirit of the woods. In mythology, the term also refers to deities or spirits of the woods.

The term in English is from the Latin *sylvus* or *silvus* meaning "forest, woods." This root is found in place names in the U.S.A. like Pennsylvania (lit. "Penn's woods") and Spotsylvania and Sylvan Lake. The first names *Sylvester* and *Sylva(i)n*, and the female name Sylvia/Silvia, are also from the Latin word.
