Spring Cleaning at Home

It is always nice to see people making improvements to their property. Properties that are well maintained and that are kept



neat and clean reflect well on the owners as well as on the whole community. Now that spring is finally here, many of us will use the warmer weather to get rid of un-needed items or to properly store things out of sight. Spring begins the garage sale season.!

This serves as a reminder to take a look at what could be cluttering your property. Things in open yards that become familier to the owner may well be unsightly to many others.

Lake County does have regulations aimed at controlling unsightly and unhealthy deposits of junk and debris on private property. The ordinance also covers noise limitations and storing of inoperable vehicles.

The County Nuisance Ordinance is administered primarily by the Planning, Building and Development Department. The ordinance can be downloaded off the internet, but generally it defines "junk and debris" as "any manufactured or constructed object which has outlived its usefulness in its original form". This includes a number of listed items such as yard waste, cartons, bottles, furniture, vehicle parts, etc. which "due to their condition and/or visibility, can reasonably be construed as being unsightly, unsanitary or dangerous". A reasonable interpretation would say then that things such as recycling bins and other debris should not be set outside until it is time for pickup by the waste hauler.


Water Quality Improvements, Section 319 Grant Status Update

In partnership with Bill Grinnell, Fremont Township Highway Commissioner, the SLIA applied for a matching IEPA Section 319 grant in May 2009. The official documents approving the \$47,800 grant were finalized in early March 2010. The project includes work to install three storm sewer catch basins designed to trap sediment and oils before discharge to the lake, streambank

stabilization in Maple Park, rock riffle installation in the Hiawatha Terrace drainage ditch to reduce erosion, and installation of a bio-swale in Valley View Terrace, off of Shady Lane. Additionally, Fremont Township will install and/or replace storm sewers at Wildflower and Hiawatha Terraces.

Plans are now being prepared for submittal to IEPA, SMC and the Army Corps

of Engineers for required permits. We therefore do not expect work to start until late summer. Some of the SLIA cost share will be made up in volunteer hours, primarily for re-planting disturbed areas. We will keep everyone informed and get the word out when volunteer sign-ups are to start. Mowing and Landscaping Services

Braulio's Lawn Maintenance of Mundelein has once again been contracted to perform lawn maintenance on various parks and terraces. As in past years, Schwerman Park and the beach area will be mowed and weeded 20 times from May through November. Wildflower, Bjorklund, Sylvan Commons, Buena and Point Comfort are done 16 times a season, while the entrances at Crescent and Highland are done 6 times. Braulio agreed to maintain last year's prices. A couple items of note this year: The mowing will be done on Wednesday in 2010, rather than Monday as in the past.

Braulio will apply a pre-emergent herbicide and fertilizer early this spring, and a broadleaf control application in May. We began these treatments last year to control weeds, especially dandelions, that were taking over many areas.




DON'T PLACE UNSTAMPED MAIL

Spring Clean-up and A Clean Lake

Keeping Our Lake Clean

It is a fact that just about <u>everything</u> that washes into the storm drainage grates <u>ends up in our lake</u> and/or easements.

That can include a number of undesirable things, such as cigarette butts, paper products, oils, salt, ashes from burning leaves



and anything else that can be washed down the drain. It is extremely important, therefore, that all of us take an interest in keeping our streets and yards free of debris. Visit the SLIA web site Environmental section to learn more.

Remember also that if you use lawn fertilizer; be sure to use a product that does not contain phosphorous. Phosphorous contributes to algae blooms in the lake. This chemical is not really necessary for established lawns anyway.
