#### Here's a few details:

In additional to the usual raking, brush trimming/ clearing, etc, we have need for some specialized help:

- Wood Bench construction (Wildflower Terrace and the area between the beach *and the dam)*
- Perennial plantings at Wildflower Terrace
- Stairway repairs at Oak Terrace
- Backstop repair/grinding at Schwerman Park
- Cut down and removal of marked trees at Hiawatha Terrace

We may need the use of a trailer to haul debris. If you can supply one, let Dan Trahan know.

There will be a roll-off dumpster at the beach again this year, but it's **ONLY** for landscape waste removed by our neighborhood volunteer crews from the parks and easements. No private garbage/junk debris will be allowed in the roll-off. We appreciate everyone's cooperation in this. Just in case, we'll be setting up a special webcam this year to catch those who feel it can be used for private use!

## Major Improvments for Sylvan Lake

### The "Section 319" Water Quality Grant Improvements

To re-cap, this project involves various improvements at the beach, Wildflower Terrace, Maple Park and Hiawatha Terrace. We have mentioned this project a number of times over the past two years, and it is good to see that it is nearing completion.

Late last fall three storm sewer catch basins were installed that are now trapping and holding sediments and road oils before they discharge into the lake. Streambank reinforcement using boulders and concrete-filled bags were placed along the Maple Park stream. A series of rock and stone check dams were installed in the Hiawatha Terrace ravine to reduce bank erosion downstream of a newly extended storm sewer outlet pipe.

Now that the snow and frost are gone, the contractor will soon be back to finish a bio-swale downstream of a storm sewer that now discharges freely into the Maple Park stream. The 100-foot long bioswale just off of Shady Lane will utilize a special soil mix and plants to absorb much of the storm water coming off the street and nearby properties. This will provide a natural filtration and water clean-up process.

The contractor and the Fremont Township Highway Department will be restoring the curbs near the beach and placing stone to direct surface runoff to the drains. As part of our SLIA share of the project, we will be organizing our own Sylvan Lake **VOLUNTEERS** (like you!) to replant the disturbed areas. We may do a separate e-mail blast to everyone and make some arm-twisting calls to solicit help, but if you would like to get on the list early and beat

#### The Street Light and Landscaping at the Highland "Point"

I don't think this "Point" designation is official, but we have received a number of compliments about the new look. Now we are waiting for the spring buds to appear! Something new that recently happened is the attachment of the correct decorative scroll arm and two banner arms on the light pole. The SLIA board is looking into ordering a decorative banner (or perhaps more than one) to better showcase our main entryway. This could expand over time to include the placement of various seasonal banners. As always, we are open to ideas. Additionally, a reflective shield was installed inside the street light lamp

to reduce the glare on the house side of the light. All of this basically completes the work here, and thanks again to Highway Commissioner Bill Grinnell for absorbing all the cost for the street light.

#### The Dam and Spillway

Repair of the 1920's concrete spillway has been on the table for a number of years. Highway Commissioner Bill Grinnell has hired an engineering firm to prepare plans and to begin the reconstruction permit process through the State of Illinois. The SLIA Board has been actively involved with Bill in developing the renovation plan and in establishing a longterm ownership and maintenance agreement for both the dam and spillway. This continues to be an ongoing process, and more information will follow.
