

Will Your Address Change? Five-Digit Addressing

Representatives from the County made a presentation to SLIA members at the Annual Meeting with regard to pending implementation of 5-digit addressing. In fact, a letter from the County to all Sylvan Lake residents may already be in your hands by the time this Shoreline issue is distributed.

Some residents already utilize a 5-digit address, however many do not. Our 2 and 3-digit addresses are actually lot numbers that date back to the original Schwerman subdivisions platted in the 1920's.

The SLIA Board and the members in attendance first learned of the County's intentions, and the reasons behind it, at this annual meeting. Representatives from Countryside Fire District, the Post Office, the County mapping department and the Sheriff's 911 center presented their reasons for this change. The bottom line deals with safety, and being able to accurately identify and locate property addresses given the automated mapping system used by the County. A SLIA membership straw poll taken following the presentation resulted in a clear majority in favor of the change.

Here's a tentative outline for some of the major components of this process –

Finalize street names:

Some of the street names may need to change. Either to have them be compliant with what was recorded on the original subdivision plat or to facilitate the assigned county five-digit addresses, or to simply remove the post directional designation. The County will work with the Homeowners Association to determine which option is best. If changes are needed, we will then get the agreement of the Fire District, Sheriff's Office, Post Office, and Fremont Township. Then final approval will come from the County Board.

Five-Digit Addressing

Finalize address list:

A cross-reference list of the existing and new addresses, owners and permanent index numbers (PIN) will be generated. This file gets supplied to all the other agencies (Fire District, Sheriff's Office, Post Office, utility companies, etc.) so that they can update their records.

Second letter:

A second letter is mailed to all the residents showing their new address. We'll explain what steps we will have taken to make this change as seamless as possible and what they will be responsible for.

Post street signs (if needed):

Work with the Fremont Township Highway Department and Lake County DOT to post any new street signs. Pass that same information onto the various GPS mapping companies, for inclusion in their next update release.

We look forward to working with you on this important project.

Leaf Burning

Its that time of year again!

As we prepare for the annual harvest of leaves we are reminded



of what we can do to make it a more pleasant experience for all.

Around the lake we have the usual leaf burning in the street. We ask people to clean up the ashes before the next rain washes things into the storm sewers and from there into the lake. Other suggested guidelines are:

- Be courteous and respectful to your neighbors, especially those with breathing problems.
- Do not burn on very windy days.
- Do not burn wet leaves. Smoke from such fires stays closer to the ground and longer in the breathing zone.
- The best time of day to burn is from mid-morning to mid-afternoon. The smoke clears the fastest at this time of day.
- Always attend, manage and control your fire. Always have a hose or water source nearby.
- Do not burn in ditches, drainage ways or within 25 feet of a body of water.
- Open burning of anything other than yard waste, such as garbage, is not permitted.

Thank you for your help and concerns in keeping our own special resource, Sylvan Lake, clean.

What Floats Your Boat or Where is Your Boat Floating.

One of the important discussions each year is what to do for the winter with boats, sailboats and paddle boats that have had very little or no use during the past season.

Again last year several of these neglected water craft were pulled up on the beach for the winter. Some were covered, some were not. Some of those that were covered had the covers blown off. The general consensus was that the over all appearance of the easements was not as pleasant or inviting as would be liked.

If you have a water craft that is stored on any of the easements, please be responsible for storing it for the winter out of the water and neatly organized on the easement.

If you have a water craft that you are not using, that may be full of water and not easily moved, please consider having it removed, junked or sold.

If anyone needs help in moving their water craft please ask a neighbor or put a message on the SLIA message board on the web site to ask for assistance



Good News/Bad News Dam update:

Here is the good news! Design plans for the rehabilitation of the dam are still being finalized by Highway Commissioner Bill Grinnell and his consulting engineer. Some of the key work items being planned are:

- replacing the culvert and spillway
- relocating a sewer pipe
- sheet piling reinforcement
- timber guardrail
- pavement resurfacing with curbs from the bridge to Midlothian Road
- boulder covered slope on the east side of the dam



It is too early to predict a start date since State agencies must first review the plans and issue permits. The project must then be advertised for bidding.

There will certainly be inconveniences, but the Board of Directors will do it's best to keep everyone informed. We will pass on pertinent information by email and the web site to give everyone as much notice as possible.


