


A Luminary Success

Your Political Help is Needed

Gilmer & Midlothian Intersection & Hwy 53 Under Review

Last fall the Lake County Division of Transportation offered a public meeting regarding the possible Gilmer Road and Midlothian Road Intersection Improvements

The purpose of that meeting was to introduce their study, solicit public comments and opinions, and gather information to supplement the existing conditions data. Maps, exhibits, and a presentation were available for viewing at the meeting.

Lake County's projected increase in traffic for Gilmer and Midlothian for the <u>next 15 years</u> is **only 10%** due to the <u>possibility</u> of highway 53 being extended into Lake County and absorbing a lot of the Gilmer traffic. If 53 is not extended the 10% increase could well be 110%.

So the elephant in the room is still the Highway 53 extension. The recent hearings and meetings on this extension has indicated that the concept is good, the will of the people is behind the extension, but the funding (again) is lacking.

As Western Lake County's population increases, its infrastructure needs to grow, too.

In many ways, Lake County has met the challenges posed by dynamic growth. One area, however, stands out where the County hasn't done as well. We've added countless small, residential streets in new subdivisions, but building of new through streets has been at a virtual standstill for decades. The result of this neglect is that our major throughways are more crowded than they've ever been. And it's only getting worse. With each passing year, commutes get longer and more frustrating.

The traffic flow on our roads-- people going to work, school, or play, and goods and services being brought to our homes, or taken from our factories and stores to their customers-- is literally the lifeblood of Lake County. It would be a genuine tragedy if Lake County were to lose its vibrancy to "clogged arteries." To keep Lake County healthy, we must care for its "circulatory system", just as we've cared for its safety through fire protection, and its educational level through schools. Historic Long Grove, that has for years effectively stopped the 53 development, is slowly fading from view due in part by the lack of any major throughways and gridlock

It seems Western Lake County is in need of some political awareness regarding our future if complete gridlock is to be avoided. Can you help? Call our State Senator, State Representative and County Representative and let them know your concerns.

Ray Lake Forest Preserve now open

New trails and public access await you at the newly opened Ray Lake preserve just a few miles north of us, Gilmer Road to Erhart. The preserve's entrance and 25-car asphalt parking lot are located on Erhart Road in Fremont Township. Hikers, bicyclists and cross-country skiers can enjoy a 2.7-mile crushed gravel trail that loops around wetlands and includes three boardwalks and a scenic overlook. Remember to keep your dogs leashed.

An underpass connection to the Fort Hill Trail at Gilmer Road is currently under construction. When the connection is complete in summer of 2012, trails at Ray Lake will be open to bicyclist and equestrians as well.

Dog Exercise Area

Hours have been extended for all Dog Exercise Areas. Fairfield & 176 Construction Starts spring 2012

Lakewood Forest Preserve will benefit from a major Lake County Division of Transportation (LCDOT) road improvement project planned to begin this spring in Wauconda. The project includes widening and improving the intersection of Fairfield Road and Route 176, adding naturalized detention ponds for stormwater management, and doing extensive plantings and reforestation work. As part of the project, Lakewood's existing preserve entrance on Route 176 will be replaced and new turn lanes added to improve safety. Two new trail underpasses will be built along Route 176 for the Millennium Trail and Fort Hill Trail so trail users will not have to cross highway traffic.
