### The beach

The beach at Sylvan Lake is meant for use by homeowners and their families and friends.

We are occasionally having issues with young people – middle and late-teenage years – who are coming to the beach without their families and bringing many friends with them. Problems happen when these friends are loud and raucous, sometimes drinking and smoking, sometimes taking over the pier, and sadly often using language that other beach-goers don't want around their small kids.

We need homeowners to discuss this with their kids. It comes down to a matter of responsibility and respect. Ask them to bring only a few friends at a time to the beach, and then show consideration for other people at the beach with their behavior. Remember, the Lake Rules and Regulations (available on the SLIA website) require that children under age 15 be accompanied by an adult.

When not accompanied by an adult homeowner, ask your teenagers to bring no more than 3 or 4 friends with them

to the beach. If a larger group of teenagers is going to use the beach, there needs to be a parent present to monitor the group.

We have operated as a Neighborhood Watch community for many years. If you see people you do not know, especially if they do not appear to know the rules of the beach, you can direct them to the rules sign. Also, if you ask them for information, you can ask who they are visiting and confirm whether or not the Sylvan Lake member is present in their group. You can then call a board member and describe the group size and behavior that brought them to your attention. The board will contact the homeowner.

Huge recognition and thanks to everyone that came out to work on 5/19 for our annual Clean up day. It was great to see the shoulders of our roads throughout Sylvan stacked with debris.

Here are just some of the many highlights of the day.

- Front entrance-ways at Midlotheian and Gilmer: general cleanup and plantings
- Beach and dam area, added sand, put in piers and swimming markers, trimmed suckers off the big willow tree, planted flowers in pots and general clean up
- Schwerman Park: shrubs trimmed, volleyball courts cleaned up and racked
- **Briar Terrace:** Walking path cleared from street almost to the water. Continued path work completion ETA this summer
- West Sylvan Roadway clean up
- Ravinia Park: built new step bridge, burned debris, general cleanup
- **Hiawatha Park:** debris cleanup, weed pulling, dead tree cut down, weeds vs native plant training

#### On going Summer work;

- Fremont Township will be removing several dead trees along our roads
- 6 dead trees to be removed from south shore side of Ravinia
- Wildflower Terrace: possible edging to define wildflower influence over the years
- Looking to plant some native trees as a way fill the area in created by the dead removed trees....red buds, white oak are some possibilities

Bring a dish to pass and your own liquid refreshments and meet at the at the beach for a neighborhood picnic.




# Dam update: Maybe this fall 2012!

### Still in the plans, time line slightly delayed in processing plans and permits.

Design plans for the rehabilitation of the dam have been finalized by Highway Commissioner Bill Grinnell and his consulting engineer. The plans are currently under review and permits are being processed in Springfield. Some of the key work items being planned are:

- replacing the culvert and spillway
- relocating a sewer pipe
- sheet piling reinforcement
- timber guardrail
- pavement resurfacing with curbs from the bridge to Midlothian Road
- boulder covered slope on the east side of the dam



There will certainly be inconveniences, due to the road being closed for rehabilitation but the Board of Directors will do it's best to keep everyone informed. We will pass on pertinent information by email and the web site to give everyone as much notice as possible.

### Hwy. 53

It appears that the only funding capable of a project of this size is thru the Illinois Tollway Commission. Therefore, all the eggs are in this one basket and Illinois politics may be observed at its best.

The blue ribbon committee established to make recommendations to the Tollway Commision on the development of the Hwy. 53 extension up into Lake County has met for the last time to fine tune its recommendation.. When information is released we will pass it along

Some of the rumors are that all of Hwy. 53 would need to be converted to a tollway, the extension into Lake County would have a maximum speed limit of 45 mph and have limited access ending at 120 in Grayslake.
