

General ice thickness guidelines When is ice safe?

You can't judge the strength of ice just by its appearance, age, thickness, temperature, or whether or not the ice is covered with snow. Strength is based on all these factors -- plus the depth of water under the ice, size of the water body, water chemistry and currents, the distribution of the load on the ice, and local climatic conditions.



As a general rule for new, clear ice only:

- * 2" or less STAY OFF
- * 4" Ice fishing or other activities on foot

Enjoy the lake this winter, hope for a smooth freeze and BE SAFE!

I'm proposing that we have 2 clean up days. One in the Spring, as usual and one in mid fall. Details to follow




Sylvan Lake Hi-Tech Mission Still Needs Your Help!

Township Residents can Now Dial a Ride

The Lake County Coordinated Transportation Services Committee's (LCCTSC) Northwest Demonstration Project (NW Demo) began in January 2010 to provide curb-to-curb dial-a-ride transportation service in the northwest Townships of Lake County: Antioch, Avon, Grant and Lake Villa. Recently, *services have been expanded to the Townships of Fremont and Wauconda*. The NW Demo is available to seniors 65+ years, people with disabilities and the general public.

Wauconda and Fremont Township residents can reserve transportation trips to three destinations: College of Lake County, Gurnee Mills Area and the Greenleaf Medical Offices on Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 9:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. More drop-off locations will be added in January.

These calls are not coming from the Registry or the Federal Trade Commission, and you should not respond to these calls. Have You Changed Your Electric Supplier? by Donn Hamm

You have a choice on your electric supply – but what does this mean?

If you have changed your electric supplier from ComEd I would like to hear from you.

Please email me dehamm@comcast.net; with the following information:

- To what company did you change your electric supply?
- How long have you been changed?
- Have you realized any savings?
- Have you had any problems with the new supplier?

There are so many choices and most of the choices seem to be a 15% to 30% savings over ComEd. To help other Sylvan Lake Residents understand the advantages and disadvantages of changing their electric supplier, I



would like to know what other electric suppliers Sylvan Lakers have switched to. Your name will be confidential.

The county and the State of Illinois have indicated that our residents have a choice on who provides the supply portion of their electric service and choosing a different electric supplier may be able to save us money.

Any Lake County resident can choose to purchase their electricity supply from an alternative supplier other than ComEd. Many municipalities have already made changes for their entire city. Essentially, this means we can shop for suppliers providing service in your area and compare prices, charges, other terms, and select a new supplier.

The State of Illinois has a web-site to view many choices, but some of these choices are not in our area.

According to the State of Illinois, if you choose a different supplier, the only difference is a new price for electric supply on your bill. You will continue to call ComEd for outages, emergency services, and questions about your residential service.

So please share your research and experiences and I will share that information with other Sylvan Lake residence.

New Dam Rehabilitation News

The long and short of the dam rehabilitation project is that several years ago we almost lost the causeway, down the hill side of the dam, due to a very heavy rain and run-off. When the increased water went through the dam and over the causeway it started to undercut the causeway and wash it away. Highway Commissioner Bill Grinnell, our township road commissioner, put almost 10 yards of concrete under the causeway to keep it in place.



Due to this repair work the dam needed to be inspected.

The inspection revealed that our hand built dam from long ago had not been permitted or classified, and although the inspection indicated that we had currently a solid dam, the new #2 dam classification required that an emergency plan be created to drain the lake down to protect the roads and community downstream from Sylvan Lake. Hence the dam needs an upgrade.

The plan is still in the permitting phase and includes adding a new emergency drain pipe with a valve that can be opened to drain down the lake. This drain pipe would only be used in the event that there was a fear the dam would fault and break causing the rush of water to possibly wash out or flood Midlothian Rd. and Cripple Creek Drive into the Indian Creek Club community.

The dam project, which is still in the final pursuit of getting permits from the engineers, county, state and core of engineers has some pretty solid plans. The plans include:

- the emergency drain pipe,
- slightly raising the road but keeping it a single lane,
- replacing the culvert and spillway relocating a sewer pipe
- sheet piling reinforcement
- · new guardrail
- pavement resurfacing with curbs from the bridge to Midlothian Road
- a covered slope on the east side of the dam to prevent erosion
- a slight adjustment to the Midlothian road junction for better safety.
- relocating the water and sewer lines so that they will be underground.

Highway Commissioner Bill Grinnell estimated that the project would require 3 to 6 weeks to complete.

Bill indicated that the project should be permitted and ready for bidding by this spring but suggested that, for the benefit of the community, he would prefer to start the project in the fall of 2013, so we have the whole summer for our recreational needs. "Draining the lake down in the spring when the lake is at its highest and then hoping that the lake fills back up for the summer recreational activities is a bit chancy" said Bill.

As you can already guess, there is going to definitely be some inconvenience for the community during the construction by shutting down 50% of our entrances and exits. **The Midlothian entrance/exit during construction will be closed.** There will be no alternative but to use the Gilmer entrance/exit for the residence during construction.


Local Community Information

Route 53/120 is Moving Forward... Slowly

The following information was sent from Paula Trigg, P.E., Lake County Engineer and Director of Transportation.

The Tollway did release the following information regarding the current status of the 53/120 project:

This message is to provide an update on activities related to the Illinois Route 53/120 project. As you know, the Blue Ribbon Advisory Council submitted their Resolution and Summary Report to the Illinois Tollway Board of Directors in June. Since then, a number of activities have taken place to advance the project.



Board Action The Tollway Board of Directors referred the Council's report to their Strategic Planning Committee. After thorough review, the Committee determined the Tollway should participate in future steps toward project development, including a corridor land use plan and developing engineering details.

Corridor Land Use Plan Developing a comprehensive, corridor land use plan was one of the key recommendations of the Council. Lake County and the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP) have taken a first step forward toward developing the plan - securing planning assistance through CMAP's Local Technical Assistance (LTA) program. It will take some time to communicate with all the parties expected to participate in the plan, coordinate funding, and for CMAP to secure a consultant to lead the plan's development. The corridor plan could be underway by mid-2013.

Detailed Engineering Concept The Council's report established the project's design features, performance requirements and environmental commitments. The next step is to develop engineering details to fully understand the transportation impacts of project, consider capital and operating costs, and develop funding and financing options. The Tollway is in the process of procuring a consultant to lead these tasks, and work is expected to begin next year. More detail about this contract can be found under item #3 in the Tollway's current Professional Services Bulletin.

Take an Evening Hike Along Solar Lighted Trails

With small solar lights to guide their way, hikers, skiers and snowshoers can now get some brisk evening exercise at Old School Forest Preserve in Libertyville, and along a hilly, scenic section of the Millennium Trail adjacent to the Winter Sports Area at Lakewood Forest Preserve in Wauconda.

Though regular preserve hours are 6:30 a.m. to sunset, the illuminated trails and adjacent parking lots will remain open after sunset until 9 p.m., daily through March 9. Bicycle and equestrian traffic is not permitted on the lighted trails after sunset. Dogs are allowed but must be leashed.

To access the lighted trails, park at Lakewood's Winter Sports

Area, located on the east side of Fairfield Road just south of Route 176, or at Old School's main entrance lot, located on the east side of St. Mary's Road just south of Route 176. Lake County Forest Preserve Rangers regularly patrol the areas.
