Chris Hinricksen Recognized at Advocate Condell Ceremony

Libertyville, IL – At their annual Volunteer Awards & Recognition Celebration during National Volunteer Appreciation Week in late April, Advocate Condell officials celebrated their team of 477 volunteers who dedicated a total of 50,448 hours in 2012.

The annual celebration recognized 100 volunteers for their continuous dedication and service, as well as Mundelein resident Chris Hinrichsen for having the highest number of service hours. New Rules on Registration/ Titling of your Watercraft

It is your responsibility to make sure that <u>your</u> watercraft registration is current.

All Sylvan Lake Watercraft Will Need a <u>Water Usage Stamp</u> or a license!

Canoes, kayaks and paddle boats are no longer required to be titled/registered in Illinois (UNLESS they have a motor or sail;) but canoes, kayaks and paddle boat owners will need to purchase a 'Water Usage Stamp' for \$6.00 per calendar year for the first three vessels and \$3.00 for any additional vessels, all passes must be purchased at the same time to receive the discount.

Water Usage stamps are mandatory. They should be available, over the counter, at any point-of-sale vendor starting July 1, 2013. (Marine sales and fishing equipment retailers.)

No titles, registration cards, and/or decals are issued over the counter at any Natural Resources Offices. Applications are processed by mail at the Springfield Office. Please allow time for processing.

Don't forget your PFDs (personal flotation device) one per person in your boat.

Round-About or Run Around?

From reports of the recent community meeting with the Lake County Division of Transportation, April 17th, the proposed redevelopment of the intersection of Midlothian and Gilmer Roads seems to still be on track for a roundabout configuration. There is a consensus that this is motivated by a generous amount of theory but far less hard facts as to the impact on this community's prominent intersection.

It may even be theorized that our Division of Transportation would like to use this intersection as an experiment. If the experiment is a success we win, and if not, well, we are stuck with the failure.

There is no question in my mind that a roundabout will be a convenience during non-peak times of the day. The real questions are the effects during the rush hours.

Some unanswered questions remain:

How many vehicles can pass through this roundabout design efficiently in an hour?

How efficient is this design for extremely heavy traffic from two directions intersecting at 90°.

What impact will backed-up traffic from the Canadian Central Railroad, just south of this intersection, have on the intersecting traffic?

What impact will the increased volume of traffic effect this intersection if the 53 extension does not receive funding and is not built?

Will the projected constant flow of traffic on Gilmer and Midlothian not allow for Sylvan Lake residence to enter the flow of traffic during rush hours from Cresent or Highland?

This may be the best design for this intersection, but maybe not. It would be helpful to have more facts.

Rt 53 Extension Still Moving Forward

The Illinois Tollway Board of Directors approved a \$4 million contract at its meeting to Schaumburg-based TranSystems Corp. that will continue to plan for the proposed extension of Illinois Route 53/120 in Lake County. TranSystems will develop a detailed engineering concept, evaluate cost estimates, refine traffic and revenue analyses and survey customers' willingness to pay tolls on the proposed extension. The contract also includes services to study the environmental and economic impacts of the project.

After the completion the TranSystem contract there will still need to be determined how to fund this extension

The Illinois Route 53/120 Extension is expected to cost between \$2.3 and \$2.7 billion. Cost estimates developed as part of the detailed engineering concept will inform future discussions on how to finance the project and potential sources of revenue. This could include local and other sources, as recommended by the Council.

Oh Dam, update: Maybe this fall 2013!

Design plans for the rehabilitation of the dam have been finalized by Highway Commissioner Bill Grinnell and his consulting engineer. Some of the key work items being planned are:

- replacing the culvert and spillway
- relocating a sewer pipe
- sheet piling reinforcement
- timber guardrail
- pavement resurfacing with curbs from the bridge to Midlothian Road
- boulder covered slope on the east side of the dam

It is too early to predict an absolute start date since State agencies are still in review of the plans and the need to issue permits. After the permit is obtained then the project must be advertised for bidding. It is still hoped that this work can be started and completed this fall when the lake is a little lower

There will certainly be inconveniences, due to the road being closed for rehabilitation but the Board of Directors will do it's best to keep everyone informed. We will pass on pertinent information by email and the web site to give everyone as much notice as possible.

MAILBOX REPAIR?

If your mailboxes is in need of repaired they should be 40" – 42" above the finished grade of the shoulder. Mailboxes should also be 8" off from the edge of the pavement. Mailboxes should have standard pressure treated 4" x 4" posts for support.
