


Garden Club News

Our nephew, Kyle, has been coming to Sylvan Lake to fish the Carp-O-Rama since he was eight. You are probably wondering, "What does it matter?"

Kyle is twenty years old and has epilepsy. He has watched his brother who is a year older go off to college and his sister who is three years younger get her driver's license.

During the past couple weeks his seizures have returned and have become unmanageable. He was taken from the soccer field, found bloody in a bathroom, and was unable to march in the parade today with his Explorers Unit. He could not compete in the Special Olympics this year because he experienced his third seizure of the week the day before the regionals. (He did sing the national anthem for the opening ceremony.) For the first time he is experiencing fear about his condition. He has been told that physical exertion may be the trigger and that he may not be able to participate in sports.

Can you imagine his delight when he claimed second place in the Carp-O-Rama? So what does it matter?

It mattered a great deal to this young man.

around 7 pm. However, after the bloom, seed pods form on the main stem and can disperse up to 1000 seeds per plant. This creates a boom of an invasive species, requiring expensive herbiciding and or hand removal.

I removed nearly 100 of them last evening from Ravinia. This is an area I have been diligent with, and now many new Jack-in-the-pulpits are present. These are plants we want.

Also, Garlic mustard is having a fun time spreading all over, its easy



to pull right now, even if you get the majority of the plant, that helps because the seed pods can not form. Both Garlic mustard and Dame's rocket are from the mustard families, smell different, but can and do appear together.

Enjoy on the roadsides of other neighborhoods! But not here.

Our New Neighbors to the West. Hawthorn Hills 230 home Development Update

On Monday, April 21, Gary Goldblatt and Donn Hamm attended the Hawthorn Woods Village Board Meeting and had the opportunity to put on record the concerns of Sylvan Lake in regard to the large development to our west. Those concerns were detailed as the potential for silt and mud migration into our lake during the development, water quality entering our lake from the runoff from the homes and retail development/parking lot proposed for the corner of Midlothian and Gilmer, and lastly the added traffic congestion especially at Crescent and Gilmer.



Hawthorn Woods Chief Administrator, Donna Lobaito, thanked us for our input and invited us back on Thursday April 24th for a closer look at the details in this development. This meeting was attended by Gary Goldblatt, Warren Young and Donn Hamm. These officials gave us an overview of the development and the safeguards that are being built in to protect all the water management in the development site. Gary asked who would be the go-to and responsible party if we should have any water management problems from the development and we were assured that the developer would be responsible, but that Hawthorn Woods has the power to stop all development and construction if a problem developed.

As to the traffic concerns, there are several alternatives being considered.

More housing is being explored



There is approximately 4.5 acres on the south-east corner of South Sylvan Drive and Midlothian that is being looked at for the possibility of a small housing development. A contractor has started looking at the possibilities with the Lake County Building and Development. Here is a summary of the questions being asked in regards to this property.

The Lake County Department scheduled an Early Assistance meeting on Tuesday, May 27th, for the property located at 21377 Sylvan Dr. South, unincorporated Mundelein. The applicant has requested the following:

• Rezoning from the R-1 district to the R-3 district; • Subdivide to 12,000 square foot lots; • Request to connect to Lake County public sewer; • The property size is 4.5 acres; • The developer's name is Michael Schall.

As this is the first we are hearing about this exploration, we will be very interested in several aspects.

- 1. Will the development be for single-family homes?
- 2. Will the homes be part of the SLIA?
- 3. Will the development be ultra sensitive to run-off into Sylvan Lake during and after construction?
