
Food Drive to Benefit Fremont Township

Monarch Waystation



Wildflower Terrace is now officially a Monarch Waystation!

A plaque will be installed in the near future. This designation recognizes the use of a variety of plants that support Monarchs at all stages. Visit www.MonarchWatch.org if you would like to learn more.

If you haven't stopped by, there are many beautiful, blooming plant varieties in the garden area, most of them native to our area. If you are thinking of adding some new plants to your landscape, natives are a great choice, not only are they beautiful, they are deep rooted, which result in reduced need for watering, added fertilizer and chemical pesticides. At the same time, they support Monarchs and other butterflies, birds, and pollinators while stabilizing soil to prevent erosion. We left labels by most of the plants to help you identify plants that you might like to try in your own garden. True natives are available at very reasonable prices at native plant sales in the spring. They are sponsored by Conserve Lake County, the Lake County Forest Preserve and Citizens for Conservation and others.

Continuing to remember a Sylvan Lake Faithful

This is the story about my Dad Sam Roland.

Sam Roland moved into Sylvan Lake in 1969 with his wife Dorothy and their children. They have 7 children, 6 sons and 1 daughter. They knew it would be the perfect place to raise their family with the surrounding parks and the lake. And it still is!

Sam is a WWII veteran, along with being a Korean and Vietnam veteran. He was in the Navy for over 23 years. He was a E9 Master Chief. He then worked at the Glenview Post Office for the next 20 years. He married the love of his life, Dorothy in 1946 and they were married 52 years until she passed away in 1998. Sam now has 15 grandchildren and 12 great-grandchildren. He will have another great-granddaughter very soon.

Sam just celebrated his 100th birthday, and relatives and friends came from all over the country to attend this special celebration. He went to the Chicago Cubs game the day before his birthday, and they treated him like royalty. He loves watching the Cubs, and that was his first Wrigley game. An anonymous retired Marine had sent him free tickets. He had a great day! He was also honored at the Brewers game in Milwaukee along with other veterans on the field.
