Referendum for Single Waste Hauler Passes in Township

Proposition To Authorize The Township To Exercise The Powers Of The Township Refuse Collection And Disposal Act to enter into a contract for the collection, disposal, composting or recycling of garbage, refuse and ashes within the unincorporated area of the Township?

This proposition was passed at our November election and an advisory committee will soon be formed to work with the township board to start the mechanics of possibly selecting a single service supplier for this service.

After a committee is selected it will reach out to unincorporated Fremont Township residents to determine the different options most residents would prefer. These options would then put out to bid with the refuse collection companies available in our area. It is hoped that services with better options and fees can be contracted to a single company, instead of the three now being used in Sylvan Lake, and for the betterment of all the unincorporated township and residents.

The committee may be assembled after the holidays to start researching refuse collection options and developing bid requests from refuse collecting companies.

Diana O'Kelly, Fremont Township Supervisor indicated that the goal is for better refuse collection options such as leaf pick-up, better pricing and fewer heavy trucks on the township roads.

All Watercraft removed from Beach

State of the Lake By Gary Goldblatt. SLIA President

Greetings fellow Sylvan Lakers! And Happy Holidays to you all and your families. Early big snowfall has made our lake look beautiful. I'm looking forward to seeing the lake freeze up and the hockey and ice games being played by all. I'm also hoping for an equally early Spring....

The SLIA board held it's last meeting of the year on November 14th. We reflected on the improvements made this year which included Juneau Easement repair, updated Boat policy, Rules and Regulation execution, long range budgeting, Maple Park shoreline restoration plans, successful Oktoberfest that netted a savings of \$251.00 in expenses over 2017, 98% member paid assessments, one of our largest annual meeting turnouts in years that included many new neighbors and one garbage hauler contract that will be negotiated and executed by Fremont Township. One of our biggest wins was that the SLIA board is now fully staffed with 9 volunteer board members as we head into 2019. I'm excited about 2019 as our focus will remain on making improvements, remaining fiscally responsible, and conformance to the SLIA by- laws and rules and regulations.

With some pretty large expenditures in 2018 related to downed trees, easement improvements, sand at the beach, etc., we managed a slight improvement in our total bank accounts over 2017. (most of which is in reserves)

TY: \$147,928 add to that a receivable of \$1610.00 in 2018 past due assessments brings our total to \$149, 838 vs: LY \$148, 517. Our P&L continued to decline as increased fixed expenses have increased over the years.

TY: - \$25.8 (\$11.5 includes some unexpected tree work and Maple park prep work for 2019) LY: -\$3.9

**Volunteering is the # 1 way to improve our bottom line while continuing to make improvements in our community. Thank you to the many, many of you of all ages that continue to volunteer. It makes a big difference and is much appreciated.

REMINDERS FOR 2019:

*Annual assessments have been raised to \$400.00 a year. This will be reflected on the 2019 assessment statements that will be in the mail around January 4th and due by February 28. 10% Late fees will apply and are cumulative.

*Members who own rental property and renters- A copy of your rental lease must be current and on file with SLIA. (per part D, page 6 of SLIA Rules and Regulations) and updated as per renter turnover. If not, then this would be considered a violation of Part D of Rules and Regulations and action to comply would follow.

*Oktoberfest 2019- will need a captain.

Time To Clean The Dryer Vent/ Furnace Filter

Clothes dryer fires account for over 15,000 structure fires, 15 deaths, and 400 injuries annually.

"Failure to clean" is the leading factor contributing to clothes dryer fires.

Please check all parts of your clothes dryer venting and inspect for an accumulatio on of lint, <u>especially</u> at the very end of the vent as it leaves the house.

This is also a good time to inspect and maybe replace your furnace filter if you have a forced air system. Your furnace will be much more efficient with a clean filter and will save you money with less dust recirculated in your home


Here's How to Print the Sylvan Lake Phone Directory

Lake County Recorder of Deeds, Mary Ellen Vanderventer is warning residents there are companies contacting Lake County homeowners in an effort to provide you with a certified copy of the deed to your home for an outrageous payment of \$87.00.

You don't need to pay a company for this service. All requests for copies of deeds should be handled directly through the Recorder's office. The average deed is four pages or less, with a copy fee of only \$1 per page.

I would encourage anyone with a question, concern or need for a copy to contact the office directly at (847) 377-2575.

They will be happy to send you whatever paperwork you need, at the statutory cost, without any handling or postage fees.
